*For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." John 3:16*



## Israel in the News

**Israel's Netanyahu backs sub purchase amid calls for inquiry:** Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Sunday tried to downplay a brewing scandal over the purchase of German submarines, saying his only consideration in ordering the deal was fortifying the country's security. Netanyahu's comments came amid calls for an inquiry after it was revealed that his personal attorney, David Shimron, had represented the German company building the submarines. The reports into Shimron's involvement in the \$1.5 billion sale raised concerns over a potential conflict of interests. Suspicions of impropriety were heightened after former Defense Minister Moshe Yaalon said he was sidelined on the purchase plans — which went forward after he was replaced. Israel has ordered six submarines from Germany over the past two decades, with the final one scheduled to be delivered in 2018. Israel recently decided to purchase three new ones to replace its older submarines.



## National Headlines

**Trump assembling cabinet:** President-elect Donald Trump has begun the lengthy process of interviewing candidates and assembling his cabinet. Thus far Trump has appointed Reince Priebus as his White House Chief of Staff, Steve Bannon as Senior Counsel to the President, and Ret. Gen. Michael Flynn as National Security Advisor. Trump has nominated Alabama Sen. Jeff Sessions for U.S. Attorney General, and Kansas Sen. Mike Pompeo for CIA Director. Trump is also currently interviewing candidates for remaining cabinet positions including: Secretary of State, Secretary of Defense, and Treasury Secretary. Candidates include Gen. James Mattis, Rudy Giuliani, John Bolton, Mitt Romney, and Nikki Hayley.

**Cast of “Hamilton” uses theater to make political statement:** The cast of the Broadway show “Hamilton” Made an unannounced public statement at the end of their performance to Vice President-elect Mike Pence who was leaving the theater. The statement called out the VP-elect and Trump Administration to represent all Americans, falsely depicting the new administration as being prejudiced toward certain ethnic and racial groups.

**Drought and arson ignite wildfires across the Southeast:** Wildfires throughout the Southeast are causing millions of dollars worth of damages, threatening the health and safety of residents. Arson is the suspected cause, according to authorities. More than 5,000 firefighters and support staff from around the nation have traveled to the Southeast to try and contain the blazes, the U.S. Forest Service told the Associated Press. The fires are in seven states – Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, Tennessee, Kentucky and the Carolinas.

**Congressman’s grandson brutally murdered in Chicago:** Two juvenile murder suspects have been taken into custody in the slaying of U.S. Rep. Danny Davis’ grandson, police said Saturday night. Police called the shooting of the 15-year-old a targeted attack stemming from an argument over gym shoes. Jovan Wilson, whose paternal grandfather is Davis, was killed about 7 p.m. Friday while his mother was out picking up dinner for the family, Guglielmi said. The incident originally was believed to be a home invasion, he said, but police later learned that wasn’t the case.



## Global Headlines and Prophetic World Events

**Asia-Pacific leaders vow to fight protectionism:** Asia-Pacific leaders vowed Sunday to fight protectionism at the close of a summit upended by US President-elect Donald Trump's shock victory and virulent attacks on free-trade deals. "We reaffirm our commitment to keep our markets open and to fight against all forms of protectionism," said the final statement from the summit of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) group. Rising protectionism in Europe highlighted by Britain's exit from the European Union and in the United States underscored by Trump's election was a major concern at the two-day summit in the Peruvian capital Lima. A key concern were remarks made by Trump during the election campaign that he would abandon the US-led Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), a free-trade deal that covers 12 regional economies. Trump had also shocked global markets by threatening to tear up existing free-trade pacts involving the United States.

**Death toll rises in Indian train crash:** The casualty toll climbed to at least 115 dead and 150 injured in the derailment of a passenger train in northern India Sunday. Police said they expect the number of dead to rise further because rescue workers have yet to access the rail cars that suffered the worst damage.
