Key Bible Verse: **Hebrews 2:1-3** — *“Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip. Israel in the News

Israel protests marathon body’s exclusion of West Bank race: Israel on Thursday said the international marathon body was injecting politics into sports by excluding an Israeli race because it passes through West Bank territory the Palestinians and most of the world considers to be occupied. The Israel Marathon Association said the Association of International Marathons and Distances Races displayed a “discriminatory nature” against the Bible Marathon that “will certainly result in great anger” among runners around the world. Next month’s Bible Marathon stretches from central Israel to the settlement of Shiloh, tracing a path described in the Book of Samuel. Organizers call the route the oldest recorded marathon in history.



National Headlines

Nearly a week after Irma, Florida Keys residents begin returning home: Hurricane Irma devastated the Florida Keys, overturning boats and toppling hundreds of homes. On Saturday, some residents were allowed to return home to see the damage.

Trump surprises 11-year-old who volunteered to mow the White House lawn: President Trump got what you might call a grassroots display of support, welcoming 11-year-old Frank Giaccio of Falls Church, Virginia, who offered to help cut the White House lawn. The White House said Giaccio wrote Trump to say he admires the president’s business acumen and runs his own neighborhood lawn-care business. The young boy was so focused on pushing the mower, he didn’t notice Trump had emerged to greet him until the president was standing right next to him in the Rose Garden.

Protesters pour into St. Louis streets after murder acquittal for ex-cop: Hundreds of protesters poured into St. Louis’ streets and some scuffles broke out as they voiced their anger after a Missouri judge on Friday ruled a white former St. Louis police officer was not guilty of murder in the 2011 shooting of a black man. Jason Stockley, 36, was acquitted of first-degree murder for killing Anthony Lamar Smith, 24. The former policeman, who was arrested in May 2016, was accused of planting a gun in Smith’s car but testified he acted in self-defense.

Hurricane Jose to stay off U.S. East Coast: Hurricane Jose’s center should pass well east of the North Carolina coast on Monday and remain offshore from Virginia to New England, the U.S. National Hurricane Center said in a forecast on Saturday. “However, an increase in the size of the storm or a westward adjustment in the track forecast could bring tropical storm conditions closer to the Outer Banks” of North Carolina, the forecaster said.



Global Headlines and Prophetic World Events

Homemade bomb explodes on packed London subway: A homemade bomb exploded on a packed London subway train during rush hour on Friday, leaving 22 people injured, police and health officials said. None of the injured is thought to be seriously hurt. Police say the explosion was a terrorist attack, the fifth in Britain this year. Britain’s domestic spy agency is helping out in the investigation. Police were alerted to an incident at 8:20 a.m. local time (0720GMT) after commuters reported a noise and a flash aboard the District Line train at Parsons Green station in the southwest of the city. Chaos then ensued as hundreds of people rushed to get away from danger.

Hundreds of flights grounded as typhoon slams Japan: A powerful typhoon ripped into southern Japan on Sunday, dumping torrential rain, grounding hundreds of domestic flights and halting train services. Typhoon Talim made a landfall in Kyushu, the southernmost of Japan’s four main islands, packing winds of up to 162 kilometres (105 miles) per hour, the Japan Meteorological Agency said.

Battered Caribbean islands threatened by another powerful storm: Tropical Storm Maria is likely to reach hurricane strength on Sunday, prompting U.S. weather forecasters to issue warnings and watches for a string of Caribbean islands, some of which were battered by powerful Irma less than two weeks before.

U.S. diplomats deliver stiff warning to North Korea: North Korea faces destruction if it continues to threaten the US and its allies, according to one of Donald Trump’s most senior diplomats, while the president unveiled the dismissive new nickname of “rocket man” for the country’s erratic ruler. Nikki Haley, the US ambassador to the UN, said North Korea was starting to feel the pinch of sanctions but added that she would be happy to turn the matter over to the military. “We all know that if North Korea continues with this reckless behaviour and if the United States has to defend itself or its allies in any way, North Korea will be destroyed,” she said.
